

EUCC - DEUTSCHLAND

Annual Report 2004

The organisation's financial situation was stabilised by participating in the research projects IKZM-Oder and Coastal Futures (both financed by the Federal Ministry of Education and Research) as well as the Interreg IIIC-project CoPraNet. The Küsten Newsletter has been gaining readers from the community of coastal experts continuously. In April, the association organised a national and an international conference in Warnemünde. In June, the first issue of the journal Coast*Line* Reports was published, followed by four more issues by the end of the year. All issues are available for free download on the homepage.

For health reasons, Carsten Droste withdrew from the organisation. The new executive, Nardine Löser, could be appointed only in November. As a consequence, the association fell behind in several activities as well as in financial administration and in the proceeding of application for public utility. In order to avoid similar problems in the future, several members were recruited to actively participate, and work was divided up. As a summary, the year 2004 can be regarded as a successful one.

Membership

The number of members grew by 20 throughout the year, reaching 91 members of EUCC-Deutschland (as of November 1st 2004). Several members are now involved in the organisation's activities (Newsletter, study modules, thematical foci etc.). Three issues of the internal member newsletter were sent out to the members.
